November 3, 2016 Working Lands: A History of Agriculture in Nevada County, 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. Scheduled at the Gene Albaugh Community Room at the Madelyn Helling Library, 950 Helling Way, Nevada City.

This is a showing of a documentary created by Jan Blake, Executive Director of the Nevada County Resource Conservation and funded by the NCRC. It incorporates interviews with 12 farming and ranching families that can trace their roots back to the 1800's in Nevada County and aired on the Public Broadcasting Services, KVIE public television. The event is sponsored by Bear Yuba Land Trust and reservations are not required. Suggested donations are \$10.

November 10, 2016 Membership Meeting, 12 Noon – Gage McKinney – author of MacBoyle's Gold. Scheduled at 431 Crown Point Circle, Suite 150, Grass Valley, CA.

Note the time of the meeting is Thursday, November 10 at noon. The time is a change from our regularly scheduled membership meeting on the first Wednesday of the month.

Author Gage McKinney will present his new book, MacBoyle's Gold, about the life and times of Mining Engineer Errol MacBoyle (1880-1949). He will discuss MacBoyle's contribution to the historic Idaho-Maryland Gold Mine, Grass Valley, and Nevada County.

# MacBoyle's Gold by Gage McKinney



Although eminent geologists at the time (early 1920's) said the mines were worked out, Errol MacBoyle believed a fortune was still hidden in Grass Valley's Idaho and Maryland Mines. He and partners acquired the mines in 1926 and created the Idaho-Maryland Mines Company. On the brink of exhausting his limited assets, MacBoyle found the paying vein and subsequently employed 1,000 men in the midst of the Great Depression.

The Idaho-Maryland Mine ultimately grew to encompass five historic mines: Idaho, Maryland,

Brunswick, Union Hill, and Eureka Mines) and became the second largest underground gold mine in California. It produced 2.4 million ounces of gold from 1862 to 1955 and reached depths of 3,280 feet below surface.

Determined to spend his money where he made it, MacBoyle funded a private relief program in the 1930's, made the Loma Rica Ranch a model for the foothills, supported conservation, established the Grass Valley airport, and founded the local hospital. McKinney argues that no individual has done more for Nevada County than this private citizen who sought no notoriety and credited his friend for his success.

Gage McKinney has written five books on the history of the foothills region, including *The 1930s: No Depression Here* and *When Miners Sang (about Grass Valley's Cornish Choir).* Though he lives and works in Sunnyvale, five generations of his family have lived in Nevada County. Mr. McKinney will have these books available for sale and signing:


Mr. McKinney is a former purchasing manager for Ingersoll Rand and currently manages subcontracts for Lockheed Martin.
