Saturday June 3 2017, 4 p.m., Dedication Ceremony for a Historical Plaque Honoring Robert S. Shoemaker, North Star Museum and Pelton Wheel Exhibit, 10933 Alison Ranch Road, Grass Valley, CA

A dedication ceremony for a memorial plaque honoring the late Robert S. Shoemaker will be held on June 3, 2017 4 p.m. at the North Star Museum and Pelton Wheel Exhibit in Grass Valley. The Sierrans raised the money to manufacture the plaque and donated it to the City of Grass Valley, owners of the Museum. The Nevada County Historical Society is the operator of the Museum.

Bob is best known locally for his activities at the Museum where he started as a docent and eventually became Director. In 2013, he was named Citizen of the Year and Director Emeritus of the Museum by the Nevada County Historical Society, in recognition of his years of service in the preservation and interpretation of Nevada County history and particularly the role of gold mining therein. Bob was also a member of the Sierrans for Responsible Resource Development and, prior to

that, the Sierra Nevada Mining and Industry Council.

Bob was an international expert in the field of metallurgy and was a major contributor to development of various processing technologies used throughout the world today. He was involved in the design of over 80 heap leach and 40 milling operations around the world. He was involved in numerous mining related organizations and was past President of the Society of Mining, Metallurgy, and Exploration and American Institute of Mining, Metallurgical, and Petroleum Engineers. Bob was inducted into the National Mining Hall of Fame in Leadville, Colorado in 2015.

This event will be attended by the Shoemaker family and friends and it is also expected that members of the Society of Mining, Metallurgy, and Exploration ("SME"), Engineering Association of Nevada County ("EANC"), Grass Valley City Council, and other interested organizations will attend. It has been advertised on KNCO radio and in the Union Newspaper, as well as through the Grass Valley Chamber of Commerce. Please turn out for this event to honor Bob and note that it will be in lieu of our monthly membership meeting for June.

Boy Scouts of America Mining in Society Merit Badge Project

Tom Jepsen, one of the Sierrans' new members, has suggested the Sierrans become involved with the Boy Scouts of America ("BSA") to assist local scouts in obtaining their Mining in Society Merit Badge. The BSA launched the Mining in Society Merit Badge in 2014 as part of a series of merit badges focused on science, technology, engineering, and math ("STEM") projects. The Society of Mining, Metallurgy, and Exploration ("SME") was instrumental in the development of the badge.

This Project will involve the development of a comprehensive program with a variety of components (including options) that that Scouts will have to complete to earn the badge. Given the education, expertise, and experience of many members of the Sierrans in the mining industry, our organization is ideally suited to developing a locally oriented program for the Scouts.


Sierrans' Scholarship Program
